

**Official Call to Convention for the  
Michigan Democratic Party’s  
2026 Fall State Convention**

**Saturday, August 29, 2026**

The Democratic Electors of the State of Michigan are hereby notified that by the direction of the Michigan Democratic State Central Committee, the 2026 Fall Convention of the Michigan Democratic Party will be held in Lansing at the Lansing Center on Saturday, August 29, 2026.

The purposes of the MDP’s 2026 Nominating Convention shall be to formally nominate Democratic candidates to the November General Election in the following contests: Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Board of Education, University of Michigan Board of Regents, Michigan State University Board of Trustees, Wayne State University Board of Governors, and State Supreme Court.

All members of the Michigan Democratic Party are encouraged to attend the 2026 State Nominating Convention.

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## I. An Overview of the 2026 State Nominating Convention Timeline

### **Sunday, May 31, 2026**

The Michigan Democratic State Central Committee approves the Call to Convention.

### **Friday, June 5, 2026**

The Michigan Democratic Party emails the Call to Convention to all members. This Call will also be available online at [michigandems.com](http://michigandems.com).

### **Thursday, July 16, 2026**

Membership Deadline to be eligible to vote at the August 15 County or District Conventions.

*\*Does not apply to Precinct Delegates, Democratic elected officials and Democratic nominees to partisan office, per MDP Rule 3.2.2.*

### **Thursday, July 30, 2026**

Membership Deadline to be eligible to vote at the 2026 State Nominating Convention. *\*Does not apply to Precinct Delegates, Democratic elected officials and Democratic nominees to partisan office, per MDP Rule 3.2.2.*

### **Friday, August 7, 2026 by 5:00 PM ET**

Deadline for MDP chartered constituency caucuses to request a meeting room and time at the Convention. Deadline for MDP chartered constituency caucuses to request an optional alternate virtual caucus meeting.

### **Monday, August 10, 2026 by 5:00 PM ET**

Deadline for candidates seeking consideration for nomination to file their candidacy.

### **Saturday, August 15, 2026**

Statewide County and District Conventions must be held on this date.

### **Monday, August 17, 2026 by 5:00 PM ET**

Deadline for Congressional District Chairs to submit committee member names to the MDP.

**Wednesday, August 19, 2026 at 6:00 PM ET**

Rules Committee meets virtually.

**Thursday, August 20, 2026 at 6:00 PM ET**

Convention Credentials Committee meets virtually.

**Tuesday, August 25, 2026 at 5:00 PM ET**

Deadline for the Democratic Nominee for Governor to file the name of a candidate into consideration for nomination as Lieutenant Governor.

**Saturday, August 29, 2026 at 7:00 AM**

Credentialing window opens for the 2026 State Nominating Convention.

**Saturday, August 29, 2026 at 1:00 PM**

All candidate petition signatures must be submitted by this deadline.

**Saturday, August 29, 2026 at 2:00 PM**

The credentialing window closes.

**Saturday, August 29, 2026**

Fall State Convention held in Lansing.

## II. 2026 State Nominating Convention

The Michigan Democratic Party will hold its 2026 Fall State Convention (the Nominating Convention) in Lansing at the Lansing Center on Saturday, August 29, 2026.

### A. Schedule for Saturday, August 29, 2026

7:00 AM – Credentialing Opens

9:00 AM - 10:30 AM – Constituency Caucus Meetings

10:45 AM - 12:15 PM – Constituency Caucus Meetings

12:15 PM - 1:00 PM – Lunch Break

1:00 PM – Candidate petition signatures must be submitted

1:00 PM - 2:30 PM – Afternoon Congressional District Caucus Meetings

2:00 PM – Credentialing closes

Beginning at 3:00 PM, the Convention shall convene for the purposes of:

1. Hearing a report on the number of Delegates
2. Hearing and voting on the report of the Rules Committee

3. Electing a Convention Chair
4. Selecting Convention Officers
5. Nominating one (1) candidate for Lieutenant Governor
6. Nominating one (1) candidate for Secretary of State
7. Nominating one (1) candidate for Attorney General
8. Nominating two (2) candidates for State Board of Education
9. Nominating two (2) candidates for University of Michigan Board of Regents
10. Nominating two (2) candidates for Michigan State University Board of Trustees
11. Nominating two (2) candidates for Wayne State University Board of Governors
12. Nominating two (2) candidates for State Supreme Court

The Convention is scheduled to adjourn on Saturday by 6:00 PM. The time of adjournment is tentative and subject to change.

The Michigan Democratic State Central Committee will meet on the floor of the convention immediately following the adjournment of the State Nominating Convention to canvass and ratify the convention proceedings.

Resolutions shall not be considered or voted on at the 2026 Fall State Convention.

No business will be permitted on the Convention floor unless it is contained in this Call.

## B. Constituency Caucus Meetings

Chartered constituency group caucuses may meet on Saturday, August 29, 2026 at either 9:00 AM or 10:45 AM at the Lansing Center, for such purposes as shall be proper and necessary. There is no specific business that Constituency Caucuses are required to conduct at the 2026 Fall State Convention.

In order to obtain a room and meeting time, groups must submit their request for a meeting room via the Caucus Meeting Request Form **no later than Friday, August 7, 2026 at 5:00 PM ET**. Caucuses who fail to meet these requirements may be denied a room or time slot at Convention.

Chartered Constituency Caucuses may alternatively choose to meet virtually between Monday, August 24, and Thursday, August 27. In order to hold a virtual caucus meeting as part of the convention, groups must submit their request for a virtual meeting via the Virtual Caucus Meeting Request Form no later than **Friday, August 7, 2026 at 5:00 PM ET**.

## C. Congressional District Caucus Meetings

The delegates from each Congressional District will meet in caucus on Saturday, August 29, 2026 at 1:00 PM at the Lansing Center for such purposes as shall be proper and necessary. The Caucuses shall adjourn by 2:30 PM.

There is no specific business that Congressional District Caucuses are required to conduct at the 2026 Fall State Convention.

The duly elected District Chairperson (or their designee) shall function as temporary Chairperson to convene and preside over the District Caucus until the permanent Chairperson is elected. In the event that the District Chair or designee is not present at the Caucus at the hour for which it is called, their place as temporary chairperson shall be filled by the County Chairperson from the county in the district having the largest number of votes in the 2024 general election for President.

## D. Democratic State Central Committee Meeting

The MDSCC will meet on the floor of the Convention immediately following adjournment of the State Nominating Convention to canvass and ratify the convention proceedings.

## III. Voting Privileges at the State Convention

All delegates to the State Nominating Convention must be registered and qualified electors of the State of Michigan. MDP Rule 3.2.1 requires a Party member must be a qualified and registered elector in order to vote on nominations for public office.

To be eligible to become credentialed and vote at the Fall State Convention, a person must be a member of the Michigan Democratic Party for at least thirty (30) days prior to August 29, 2026, which is July 30, 2026.

To be eligible to vote during a Constituency Caucus meeting or Congressional District Caucus held onsite at the Convention, a person must be a member of the Michigan Democratic Party for at least thirty (30) days prior to August 29, 2026, which is July 30, 2026.

*\*According to MDP Rule 3.2.2, the thirty (30) day advance membership requirement does not apply to Precinct delegates, Democratic elected officials and Democratic nominees to partisan office. Instead, precinct delegates, Democratic elected officials and Democratic nominees to partisan office may become members of the Michigan Democratic Party at any point prior and until August 29, 2026 when they register at the State Convention.*

## A. Membership Deadline

1. Online membership applications are available [here](#). To meet the deadline to be eligible to vote, an online contribution toward a membership or a free membership application must be submitted by 11:59 PM ET on July 30, 2026.
2. Printable membership applications are available [here](#). To meet the deadline to be eligible to vote, a hard copy of a membership application must be either: hand-delivered to Hart-Kennedy House by 5:00 PM on July 30, 2026 or mailed to Hart-Kennedy House, and postmarked no later than July 30, 2026.

3. Individuals whose memberships are current as of July 30, 2026 but expire before August 29, 2026 are eligible to become credentialed and vote if they renew on or before August 29, 2026.

## B. Credentials for the State Nominating Convention

To be eligible to vote at the Fall State Convention, a person must satisfy the membership requirements listed above. That member must also become successfully credentialed onsite in order to vote at the State Nominating Convention.

The credentialing window opens for the Fall State Convention at 7:00 AM on Saturday, August 29, 2026, and closes at 2:00 PM on Saturday, August 29, 2026.

Each member is responsible for verifying their own membership status. Each individual MDP member may confirm that they have satisfied the membership requirements and are eligible for credentialing at the State Nominating Convention.

## IV. Fall County and District Conventions prior to the Fall State Convention

All counties are required to hold County Conventions. In addition, District Conventions shall be held in the 6th, 12th, and 13th Congressional Districts in order to ensure that MDP members residing in Wayne County are represented at these conventions.

In those counties comprising more than one Congressional District, each portion of the county within one Congressional District shall be considered a “county” and shall hold a convention.

## A. Date, Time, and Place

All County and District Conventions across Michigan shall occur on Saturday, August 15, 2026. Each convention shall convene at the time and hour designated in the local Call issued by each County or District Committee.

The calls to County and District Conventions shall be issued to the delegates not less than fifteen (15) days before the Convention is held. For the County or District Conventions held on Saturday, August 15, 2026, then a call to convention must be issued by Friday, July 31, 2026.

## B. Purpose

The purpose of the County and District Conventions shall be to elect members and alternates to the State Convention Credentialing Committee. Each Congressional District shall be entitled to four delegates and four alternates on the Credentials Convention Committee. Committee members shall be apportioned among the various Counties of each District. Please see Appendix A for the 2026 Fall State Convention Credentials Committee Suggested Allocations.

Care should be taken to ensure that the delegates and alternates in each District are balanced by gender. Each Congressional District's elected members and alternates must be equally divided as practicable between men and women (determined by gender self-identification). In the case of gender non-binary committee members, they shall not be counted as either a male or female, and the remainder of the delegation shall be equally divided.

In order to be elected to the Convention Credentials Committee, a person must be a member of the Michigan Democratic Party for at least thirty (30) days prior to Saturday, August 29, 2026, which is Thursday, July 30, 2026.

The Congressional District Chair shall have the final responsibility for approving appointments to the Convention Credentials Committee and forwarding such appointments' names, emails and other contact information to the Michigan Democratic Party no later than 5:00 PM on Monday, August 17, 2026 via the Convention Committee Member Information Form.

## C. County and District Convention Delegates

Delegates to County and District Conventions shall be members of the Michigan Democratic Party residing in the corresponding County or District whose membership was renewed at least thirty (30) days prior to the County or District Convention on Saturday, August 15, 2026, which would be Thursday, July 16, 2026.

*\* Precinct Delegates, Democratic elected officials, and Democratic nominees to partisan office residing in the corresponding County or District may become members that day when they register at the County and District Conventions.*

## V. Committees for 2026 Fall State Convention

### A. Credentials

The Convention's Credentials Committee members and alternates shall be elected at the County and District Conventions, as described in Section IV above.

Members of the Convention's Credentials Committee shall meet to discuss and receive training on the credentialing process for the State Convention. Members of the Credentials Committee are encouraged to help Democrats in their County and Congressional District become credentialed. The Committee's chair shall be designated by the Chair of the Michigan Democratic Party.

Members are invited to provide credentialing support at the State Convention on Saturday, August 29, 2026. Members of the Credentials Committee are asked to attend the Convention and assist with the credentialing process, which requires a comfortability with technology. Additionally, the Committee shall meet at the call of the Chair of the Michigan Democratic Party at the State Convention, if necessary.

### B. Rules

The MDP Standing Committee on Rules and Political Reform shall meet virtually to consider rules for the 2026 Fall State Convention. The Committee will approve the final version of the rules that will oversee all business at the 2026 Fall State Convention.

Members of the Rules Committee are not required to attend the State Convention.

Invitation: All members of the Rules Committee will be emailed a zoom invitation to the meeting to the email address on file with the MDP.

## C. Eligibility and Voting Privileges

In order to be elected as a member or alternate to the Convention Credentials Committee, a person must be a member of the MDP for at least thirty (30) days prior to the County or District Convention in which they are elected, per MDP Rule 3.3.1.

In order to vote at the Convention Credentials Committee meeting, Committee members and alternates must be members of the Michigan Democratic Party at least thirty (30) days before the meeting, by Tuesday, July 21.

*\*According to MDP Rule 3.3.2, the thirty (30) day advance membership requirement in order to be elected does not apply to Precinct delegates, Democratic elected officials, or Democratic nominees to partisan office. However, they must have active membership in order to be eligible to vote at a meeting of the committee.*

## VI. Notice of State Nominating Convention

This Call shall be forwarded to all District, County, Club, and Caucus Chairs on or before June 5, 2026.

Notice of the State Convention shall also be given to Michigan Democratic Party members via email, and the Call will be posted online at [michigandems.com](http://michigandems.com).

## VII. Candidates Seeking Nomination

### A. Lieutenant Governor

The Democratic Nominee for Governor shall identify a candidate to be placed into consideration for nomination as Lieutenant Governor. The Democratic Nominee for Governor must complete the Lieutenant Governor Candidate Designation Form in order to file the candidate's name with the Michigan Democratic Party. This form must be completed no later than Tuesday, August 25, 2026 by 5:00 PM ET. The form will also be provided on the Party's website at [michigandems.com](http://michigandems.com).

Once the Democratic Nominee for Governor, as canvassed by the Board of State Canvassers following the August 4, 2026 Primary Election, has filed the Lieutenant Governor Candidate Designation Form, that candidate will be placed into consideration for nomination to the office of Lieutenant Governor, and is exempted from any petition signature requirements as noted below.

No other candidates will be eligible for consideration for nomination for Lieutenant Governor.

## B. All Other Contests

Candidates seeking consideration for nomination for Secretary of State, Attorney General, State Board of Education, University of Michigan Board of Regents, Michigan State University Board of Trustees, Wayne State University Board of Governors, and State Supreme Court Justice shall be required to complete the Declaration of Candidacy Form in order to file their candidacy with the Michigan Democratic Party. Candidates must complete the form no later than Monday, August 10, 2026 by 5:00 PM ET. The form will also be provided on the Party's website at michigandems.com. Failure to file timely will result in a candidate disqualification.

Filed candidates seeking consideration for nomination for statewide office shall be eligible for consideration if they gather a number of valid signatures equal to fifteen percent (15%) of the delegate vote (as described in the Eligibility and Allocation of 2026 Fall State Convention Delegates section), or 823 signatures, and file them with the MDP Party Affairs Director (or designated representative) onsite by 1:00 PM on Saturday, August 29, 2026. All signatures must be gathered in person from credentialed delegates. Petition circulation may begin on Saturday, August 29, 2026 at 7:00 AM. If the number of required signatures exceeds the number of credentialed delegates at the State Convention, the Credentials Committee shall meet to determine the number of required petition signatures.

Candidates who won endorsement at the 2026 State Endorsement Convention are exempted from the Declaration of Candidacy Form requirement and the petition signature requirements. Those candidates are automatically placed into consideration for nomination to the office for which they won endorsement.

Candidates who ran in the 2026 State Endorsement Convention but did not win endorsement are not eligible to seek nomination at the 2026 State Nominating Convention, per the Declaration of Candidacy Form completed by candidates prior to the Endorsement Convention.

Each candidate will be permitted to have one representative of their campaign observe the tabulation process. Additional rules about the observation process will be presented to campaigns in advance of the convention.

## VIII. Voting

All eligible members of the Michigan Democratic Party who become successfully credentialed onsite are eligible to vote at the State Convention.

Voting on the Convention floor shall be by voice vote or unanimous consent or, when prescribed the Convention Rules, by an electronic or physical voting system. If the number of candidates eligible for and seeking nomination for a position does not exceed the number of available nominations for that position, the candidate(s) may be nominated by unanimous consent.

In the event of a contested election, voting shall be available to all credentialed delegates as outlined in the Convention Rules.

## IX. Proportional Voting System

A proportional voting system (by County or by fraction of County in multi-county Districts) shall be used in County and District Conventions and Caucuses and on the floor of the State Convention. The system used shall be in accordance with the State Party Directive on Proportional Voting.

## X. Eligibility and Allocation of 2026 Fall State Convention Delegates

In order to vote at the 2026 Fall State Convention, a person must satisfy the membership requirements and become properly credentialed as outlined in this Call.

### A. Allocation

There shall be one State Convention vote for each 500 votes or major fraction thereof cast for the Democratic candidate for President in 2024 provided that no fraction of a County within a Congressional District shall be without a minimum of one vote.
